Background to Serious Incident Training Course

- 17 LA employees & 4 LA contractor employees have died at work since 2000
- Each Serious Incident required a LA response
- Some Serious Incidents involved a Criminal Investigation
- Legal advice on managing Criminal Investigation 2010 (L. Ó Braonáin SC)
- IPB Serious Incident Guidelines 2012 & 2015

Background to Serious Incident Training Course

IPB developed a Serious Incident App – Safe@Work App in 2014



Requirement for a LA tailored training course in the area of Serious Incidents

What is a Serious Incident?

- DEATH/SERIOUS INJURY to an employee(s) in the course of work,
- DEATH/SERIOUS INJURY of third party(ies) as a result of an organisational activity, and
- Accident involving INJURY TO MULTIPLE PARTIES (employees and/or third parties) as a result of an organisation's activities

CIRCUMSTANCES OF A SERIOUS INCIDENT IN COUNTY SLIGO

- Bright, clear, dry August morning 2015
- National Primary Route N4
- Type 1, Single Carriageway
- Driving lanes in either directions
- Hard shoulder and grass verge on either side
- 25km from Sligo town



- 7 employees on site, 4 Roads employees and 3 Contractor employees
- Work on hard shoulder and grass verge
- Semi Static Temporary Traffic Management arrangements in place
- Articulated truck entered work zone
 - 1 employee fatally injured on impact
 - 3 employees critically injured
 - 1 employee sustained moderate injuries



Other Factors:

- Peak holiday season, huge traffic volumes
- Fleadh Cheoil Na hEireann in Sligo town
- Site Supervisor off site
- Area Engineer off site
- H&S Advisor on 2 weeks Annual Leave
- Assistant H&S Advisor on Maternity Leave
- Roads SE on Annual Leave no mobile coverage
- Director for H&S Chairperson of Fleadh Cheoil
 Na hEireann and attending official Fleadh function
- Director for Roads at work in County Hall
 Local HSA Inspector arrives on scene within minutes

- N4 Road Closure and Diversion required
- Fire & Emergency Services on site
- Ambulance Service on site
- Gardaí on site
- Helicopter on site to airlift casualty to UCH Galway

15	H&S Officer attend Site
16	Contact Senior Engineer/Senior Executive Officer
17	Contact Director of Services
18	Contact Chief Executive
19	Contact Human Resources
20	Contact Communications Officer
21	Contact IPB insurance
22	Check progress and co-ordinate all site actions
23	Organise safe transport for employee personnel
24	Provide any assistance to H&S Advisor as required
25	Ensure basic steps followed to date
26	Contact Criminal Legal Advisor
27	Open Legally Privileged File
28	Record details of all persons on site
29	Contact the Health & Safety Authority
30	Record details of all Gardaí, HSA and Medics who attend site
31	Retain all site paperwork
32	Record all evidence removed from site by Gardaí and HSA
33	Organise Survey of Scene
34	Contact Forensic Engineer
35	Arrange contact with, and assistance for, next of kin
36	Contact Employee Assistance Provider

Incident Response

- Site Employee telephoned Site Supervisor
- Site Supervisor telephoned Area Engineer
- 3. Area Engineer initiated the Serious Incident Protocol using the Safe@Work App as his hands-on guide



Despite potential hurdles the Serious Incident Procedure was implemented in a very short time frame

Consider:

- 1. How important was it for this LA to have been **PREPARED** for a Serious Incident?
- 2. How beneficial it was to employees in this LA to have implemented the Safe@Work App?

- LGMA established Working Group Q1,2015
- Draft course content was proposed
- Following the Sligo Incident the proposal was revisited
- Lesson learned were considered and proposal amended
- Final proposal was endorsed in Q3,2016 titled: "Best Practice on How to Prepare & Respond to a Serious Incident"

- La Touche Training successful tender
- Pilot training was held in Castlebar RTC in November & December 2016
- Course content and duration varies depending on the target audience

Three target audiences:

- 1. H&S Professionals
- 2. Chief Executives and Directors of Services
- 3. Line Managers

Common Course Content:

- IPB Serious Incident Guidelines
- National Policy & Procedure on the Management of Serious Incidents
- IPB Safe@Work App

- How to <u>Prepare</u> for a Serious Incident
- How to Respond Immediately
- How to Respond the Day After a Serious Incident

Time Lines for Delivery through Regional Training Centres:

H&S Professionals – Q1,Q2,Q3 2017

 Chief Executives and Directors of Services – Q3 & Q4 2017

3. Line Managers – Q4 2017 and onwards

- Has your organisation considered IPB's Serious Incidents Guidelines?
- Are Serious Incident Procedures prepared locally?
- Are responsibilities assigned and do employees know their responsibilities?
- Is the Safe@Work App in place?

Final Thoughts & Conclusion

Response to a Serious Incident starts at the time of the Incident and may continue for years. Employees are challenged to:

- Deal with a LIVE INCIDENT SITE
- Deal with INJURED EMPLOYEES and their FAMILIES
- 3. Interact with **ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES**
- 4. Liaise with CRIMINAL DEFENCE LEGAL ADVISORS
- 5. Deal with **COURTROOM SITUATIONS**
