NPWS role



- Implement national and EU legislation and polices on nature conservation
- Implement international conventions and agreements
- Designate areas to conserve habitats and species
- Provide compensation to landowners for restrictions following designation
- Administer licensing system to regulate certain activities that impact on nature
- Conduct conservation-related research and surveys
- Manage State-owned National Parks and Nature Reserves
- Promote awareness



EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (BIRDS AND NATURAL HABITATS) REGULATIONS 2011

Minister's duties under the 2011 Regulations include:



- Designate European sites (ES) Part 3
- Set [and consent to] activities requiring consent on ES reg. 28, 29 & 30
- Restoration of ES following damage reg. 36
- Injunctions to prevent damage reg. 38
- Make submissions to public authorities on their 'own projects and plan' appropriate assessments – reg. 42(9) and (10)
- IROPI role in considering the proposal made by a public authority and, if necessary, in seeking the opinion of the Commission reg. 43
- Advice and guidance on appropriate assessment reg. 48
- Derogation licences relating to strict protection of species reg. 51-55
- Requests to public authorities to ensure compliance reg 27(9) or 42(19)

Public authority responsibilities under the 2011 Regulations



- Dual responsibility
 - Competent authority for authorisation
 - Proponent for own plans and projects
- Reg. 2 "consent" includes the process of adoption by a public authority of their own plans and projects
- Reg. 27 outlines public authority duties exercise functions in compliance with the Birds and Habitats Directives
- Reg. 42 screen plans and projects for AA (and if necessary AA) before consent
- Reg. 42(9) and (10) for public authority 'own plans or projects' which require AA, submit NIS (and any other evidence) to Minister and have regard to Minister's submissions
- Reg. 51-55 apply for derogation licence before undertaking prohibited activity
- The Minister is also a 'public authority'

Legislation

The most important legislation underpinning biodiversity and nature conservation in Ireland is the:

- Wildlife Acts 1976 to 2021 and
- European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011-2021

The Wildlife Acts 1976 to 2021 is a collective citation for the following:

- Wildlife Act 1976 (no. 39 of 1976)
- Wildlife (Amendment) Act 2000 (no. 38 of 2000)
- Wildlife (Amendment) Act 2010 (no. 19 of 2010)

- Planning, Heritage and Broadcasting (Amendment) Act 2021 (no.11 of 2021), Chapter 3

The Wildlife Act, 1976 provided a good legislative base for nature conservation. The species protection provisions, including those regulating hunting, are quite comprehensive, to the extent, for example, that they largely foresaw similar aspects of the EU Birds and Habitats Directives. However, the habitat/site protection measures in the 1976 Act were relatively weak, and were almost completely limited to measures which could be introduced in agreement with landowners. There was very limited power to ensure protection, even in the case of outstanding habitats or sites, where agreement of landowners was not forthcoming.

Nature conservation legislation was substantially enlarged and improved by the Wildlife (Amendment) Act, 2000 and the Birds and Natural Habitats Regulations.

- Site-specific conservation objectives (tool for AA)
- Comprehensive and coherent set of measures for the maintenance or restoration of all SACs





Minister issues licences and permits



2019

- Nearly 9,000 licences issued by Wildlife Licencing Unit, e.g. hare coursing, photography, deer hunting, derogations, falconry
- 69 zoo inspections carried out as the national zoo licencing authority
- 1,099 CITES* permits and certificates issued

Habitats Directive – System of Strict protection. Article 12 Prohibitions



- Animal species listed in Annex IV entitled to protection. e.g. bat, otter
- Protected anywhere not just on European sites designated for their protection
- Offence to deliberately capture, kill, disturb, destroy/take eggs, or to damage or destroy breeding or resting place
- Transposed by Regulation 51 of 2011
 Regulations

Article 16 - derogations may be issued under strict criteria



- First, it must be for a reason listed in Article 16(1)(a) to (e)
 - e.g. "in the interests of ... imperative reasons of overriding public interest, including those of a social or economic nature"
- No satisfactory alternative
- Not detrimental to the maintenance of the populations at favourable conservation status
- Licence required before undertaking activity
- Apply to Wildlife Licencing Unit: wildlifelicence@housing.gov.ie
- New application form in development and new guidance to be published
- Challenges to Ireland's implementation of system of strict protection currently before courts
- Similar general system for protection of birds: Article 5 to 9 Birds Directive

Minister listed as statutory consultee in other legislation



- Minister referred to as 'prescribed authority', 'specified body',
 'environmental authority' or 'consultation body'
- NPWS provides Minister's nature conservation observations on plans and projects subject to consent under other statutory provisions, e.g.
 - Planning and Development Act and Regulations
 - Forestry Act
 - Regulation 42(9) public authority 'own plans and projects' which require AA
