





# Just an Environmental problem?

• Cost of €281m (2021)



- But....
  - Local Authorities also produce waste
  - Lots of Local Authority Departments deal with waste
  - Local Authorities set a leadership example
  - Local Authorities must meet their legal obligations

## Construction & Demolition Waste

- Construction and development projects
  - Should provide a Resource & Waste Management plan
  - Minimise waste production
  - Segregate materials properly (e.g. facilitate recycling)
  - Reuse & recycle –e.g. by-products and end-of-waste
  - Use more secondary materials e.g. green procurement

### End-of-Waste

- National *End-of-waste* Criteria in place
  - Recycled Aggregates (EoW -N001/2023)
- Consultation on draft Regs to reform the End-of-Waste decision making process
  - Closed 11<sup>th</sup> Oct

### National End-of-Waste Decision EoW-N001/2023

### of 12th September 2023

establishing criteria determining when recycled aggregate ceases to be waste under Regulation 28 of the European Union (Waste Directive) Regulations 2011 – 2020

National End-of-Waste Decision EoW-N001/2023 establishes criteria determining when recycled aggregate resulting from a

- affect the obligation of the producer to hold and comply with a waste collection permit, certificate of registration, waste facility permit or waste/ industrial emissions licence or any other National or European legislation which may apply when
- permitting or any other legal requirements that do not depend on the status of the material as a waste; and
- negate the producers or user' statutory obligations or requirements under any other authorisations (including planning

The Environmental Protection Agency (herein referred to as the Agency) accepts no responsibility for material produced in compliance with these criteria. It is the producer's responsibility to ultimately ensure the material is fit for the intended use. It is the user's responsibility to store and use the material as specified by the producer. Any person who gives either to an authorised person, a relevant local authority or the Agency, information which to his or her knowledge is false or misleading in a material



# Waste Disposal & Recovery Levies

- Waste Management (Landfill Levy) (Amendment) Regulations 2024 (S.I. no. 442 of 2024)
  - Effective from 1st Sept
  - Blanket exemption for C&D wastes has been removed
- Circular Economy (Waste Recovery Levy) Regulations 2024 (S.I. no. 441 of 2024)
  - Effective from 1<sup>st</sup> Sept (but with different start dates for C&D wastes)
  - Recovery Levy will now apply to C&D waste (€10/t)
  - Local Authorities may be liable to pay the levy e.g. CoR sites
  - A Working Group was established to provide guidance/training to LAs

### Household Waste


- European Union (Food Waste and Bio-Waste) (Amendment) Regulations 2023 (S.I. no. 679 of 2023)
  - Effective from 1<sup>st</sup> Jan
  - Nationwide requirement for Food Waste Bin
- NWCPO study re. incentivised charging due Q1 2025
- "Reverse Register" guidance






## Household Waste Collection

- WERLA now enforcing household kerbside waste collection permit conditions (~51 waste collectors)
  - Current focus on national brown bin roll-out
  - Apartments letters recently issued to all Property Management Agenci
     Owners' Management Companies to highlight their obligations
  - LAs need to update their designated Bag collection areas





### Dublin city bin bag ban to begin this month in move to crack down on litter


# Apartments

- LA housing stock with communal waste areas:
  - LA has responsibility to facilitate a 3-bin waste collection
  - Seek your waste collector to provide kitchen caddies to individual units

### Planning:

• LA should ensure that sufficient space is available to facilitate a 3-bin waste

collection





## Commercial Waste

- Waste Management (**Food Waste**) (Amendment) Regulations 2023 (S.I. no. 294 of 2023)
  - Effective from 1<sup>st</sup> July
  - Removal of previous "Schedule 1" classes of premises effectively covers all commercial premises
  - Revised definition of a food waste "producer" now covers the occupier of premises where food is consumed or prepared, and also a person who supplies food at a premises
- Waste Management (Collection Permit) (Amendment)(No. 2) regulations 2023 (S.I. no. 104 of 2023)
  - Effective March 2023
  - 3-bin system; customer charter; incentivised charging

## Festivals & Events

- Festivals & events are no longer exempt from requirements of the Commercial Food Waste Regulations
  - Waste segregation measures should be in place
  - Where food is being supplied, a Food Waste Management Plan should be prepared
- Further scope for *Re-turn* to be involved
- LA Guidelines should be updated

# Waste Collection & Handling

- Deposit Return Scheme
  - Changes in bottle bank collection facilities?
  - DRS mining of waste bins
  - Increased cost for processing MDR



EPA focus on management of fire risk at waste facilities





# Legacy Sites

- Closed LA landfills
  - Enforcement focus of EPA
  - Ongoing need to have management oversight, to monitor, maintain capping, and manage leachate & gas
- Historic Landfills
  - S.I. no. 524 of 2008
  - Remediation programme co-ordinated by RWMPOs
- Private Unauthorised Sites
  - Option to refer "Operator/Sites of Concern" to WERLA
  - Landfill Levy should be pursued
  - Anti-Dumping Initiative funding

# Data Reporting

- Waste Annual Returns validation work by LAs is invaluable!
- If your LA collects waste keep NWCPO portal updated
- **NEMIS** requires regular updates

NEMIS manages the collection of data from local authorities and provides for statistical analysis of their performance.




